Weekly Torah Reading Schedule For 2020-2021

Study to show thyself approved unto God, A workman that needeth not be ashamed, Rightly dividing the word of truth. *II Timothy 2:15*

he Torah (Genesis through Deuteronomy) is the foundation of all Scripture. This being the case, an inadequate or erroneous understanding of the Torah makes it much more difficult to come to a proper understanding of the rest of the Hebrew Scriptures, not to mention the New Testament (which is also based on *Torah*). For this reason the Jewish sages devised a system for studying the Torah. According to ancient records, this practice was begun by Ezra (a Priest and Scribe) after the Jewish captives had returned from Babylon.

During the time of *Y'shua*, (Jesus) two different cycles of reading were in use. One cycle was accomplished in one year's time, the other took three years to complete.

~ Torah Reading Forbidden ~

During the reign of Antiochus Epiphanies (ruled from 175-164 BCE), the Jewish people were forbidden to read the Torah or to circumcise their children. Anyone caught doing so was put to death. Many were martyred because they circumcised their children. However, they managed to get around the prohibition concerning Torah reading in a very resourceful way. They set up a cycle of readings in the Nevi'im (The Prophets) which reminded them, in some way, of the Torah portion that was normally read that particular Sabbath. The connection might be a reference to a story found in

the Torah reading or even a single word that reminded them of that week's Torah passage (called a parasha in Hebrew). After reading this Torah substitute, one of the men would say; "Oh, that reminds me of the story about...," and off they would go into a discussion about that week's Torah portion without having broken the law against reading Torah. These portions from the Nevi'im became known as the Haftarah. which means "other readings."

~ Y'shua Read the Haftarah ~

In *Y'shua's* day it was customary (as it is today in orthodox synagogues) for both the weekly *Torah* and *Haftarah* portions of scripture to be read each Sabbath. This provided the basis for discussion by anyone who might want to comment upon them. It was also common to invite a distinguished guest to participate in the *Torah* or *Haftarah* readings and make whatever comments they deemed appropriate.

This was the situation in which *Y'shua* found Himself when He visited his hometown of Nazareth, and went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day, <u>as was His custom</u> (Luke 4:16). The passage He was given to read is not found in the *Haftarah* readings of today. Isaiah 61:1-2 may have been removed by the Rabbinic Jews due to the great distress and persecution they had received at the hands of the followers of Jesus (the so-called Christians) over the centuries. However, we have included it in this schedule of *Torah*

readings. This year it is located in the readings for *Nitzavim*, on 9-4-21.

Our point is this: In the first century, *Torah* and *Haftarah* reading was common practice (as it is today), and was in fact the practice of *Y'shua*, who held to many of the traditions of the *Torah* observant Jewish people which did not contradict the Scriptures. The *Brit Chadasha* attests to the fact that He both attended and participated in synagogue service on the Sabbath day, as did the Apostle Paul.

~ The Torah Cycle ~

The common practice today is to read the entirety of the *Torah*, and the companion *Haftarah* scriptures, in a one year cycle. This cycle begins on the first Sabbath after the Festival of *Succoth* (Feast of Tabernacles) with the very first reading which begins in Genesis 1:1.

Believers who are currently gathering in homes, or small fellowship groups, would do well to use the *Torah* readings as a basis for their Sabbath study. Many Jewish commentaries are available that can aid in this study; however, if you wish to have a written study and audio CD that directs its teaching of the *Torah* toward *Y'shua HaMashiach*, we recommend the *Torah Club* by First Fruits of Zion (FFOZ). They can be reached at PO Box 649, Marshfield, MO 65706, (1-800-775-4807), www.ffoz.org.

FFOZ has several different commentaries available for *Torah* study. If you are new to *Torah* study, we recommend beginning with their *Torah Club* 1.

~ Readings for the Year 2020-2021 ~

Included in this year's reading list are selected passages from the *Brit Chadasha* (Breet Hah-dah-shaw' = New Testament or ReNewed Covenant) that have some connection with the *Torah* portions. Also included are some of the Brit Chadasha readings suggested by Dr. David Stern in the Complete Jewish Bible. In many cases Dr. Stern has a large number of possible New Testament readings that correspond with the Torah readings for that Sabbath. However, since many of Stern's suggestions overlap ours, and their number is so great, we have included only those scriptures which we believe truly enhance the day's readings.

Although you may want to read all of the suggested readings during the week, do not feel that every last scripture verse must be read on *Shabbat*. It may be better to have an in-depth discussion on a few scriptures than to read everything that is being presented on a specific date. The beauty of studying the Scriptures, year after year, is that each year everyone is able to uncover new and deeper truths from what was understood the previous year.

~ Festival Readings ~

Readings are also included for each of the *Moedim*, the Festivals of the LORD (Mow-eh-deem' = appointed times). In addition, special readings of the *Megilloth* are included. (Meh-gilloat' = the scrolls of: *Song of Songs, Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes* and *Esther.*) Three of the *Megilloth* are read on or during the annual Festivals.

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In addition, *Lamentations* is read on the *Ninth of Av* and *Esther* is read during the Festival of *Purim* (see the booklet *The Traditional Festivals* (SPTTF)). While the *Ninth of Av* and *Purim* are not commanded Festivals, they are important days in the history of the Jewish people and have therefore been included in this schedule.

For *Hanukkah*, the Feast of Dedication (see John 10:22), we have prepared a special booklet entitled *Hanukkah Readings for the Believer* which may be requested by name.

In addition, we have also noted the first day of each month on the Hebrew calendar with some appropriate scripture readings.

~ Festival Teachings ~

Also available are recorded teachings on Compact Disk (CD) which focus on various Festivals (several are now also available on DVD). Please see the *Materials Order Form* for a complete listing of the materials available at this time.

~ Shavu'ot Dating ~

Hebrew Roots has always held to the Scriptural dating for the festival of *Shavu'ot* which specifies that it must fall on the first day of the week (see the booklet *Shavu'ot: The Feast of Weeks* -chapter: *The Starting Point*).

However, some of our subscribers observe *Shavu'ot* on 6 *Sivan*, according to the teaching of the Pharisees. For this reason we have included both dates for this festival.

~ Show Yourself Approved ~

It is only through continuing study that we become familiar enough with the Word of God so that we are able to rightly divide the word of truth:

"Remind them of these things, charging them before the Lord <u>not to</u> <u>strive about words to no profit, to the</u> <u>ruin of the hearers</u>.
