



## Triennial Torah Readings 2025-2028

Study to show thyself approved unto God,  
A workman that needeth not be ashamed,  
Rightly dividing the word of truth.  
II Timothy 2:15

The *Torah* is the foundation of all Scripture. This being the case, an inadequate or erroneous understanding of the *Torah* makes it much more difficult to come to a proper understanding of the rest of the Scriptures. For this reason, the Jewish sages devised a system for studying the *Torah* so the average person could come to better know God's word.

In the first century there were two different reading cycles available for use in the synagogues. The *Annual Cycle* went through the entire *Torah* and *Haftarah* readings in just one year; beginning each year on *Simchat Torah*, at the end of *Sukkot* (Feast of Tabernacles). The *Triennial Cycle* was a three year cycle that always began on the first *Sabbath* of *Nisan* (*Aviv*).

### ~ A Brief ~ ~ Torah Reading History ~

According to ancient records, the practice of *Torah* study was begun by Ezra (a Priest and Scribe) after the Jewish captives had returned from Babylon.

During the reign of Antiochus Epiphanies, the Jewish people were forbidden to read the *Torah* or to circumcise their children. Anyone caught doing so was put to death. Many were martyred because they continued to circumcise their children despite the ban. However, they managed to get around the prohibition

concerning *Torah* reading in a very resourceful way. They set up a cycle of readings in the *Nevi'im* (The Prophets) that reminded them in some way of the *Torah* portion that was normally read on that particular Sabbath. The connection might be a reference to a story found in the *Torah* reading, or even a single word that reminded them of that week's *Torah* passage (called a *parasha* in Hebrew). After reading this *Torah* substitute, one of the men would say: "Oh, that reminds me of the story about..." and off they would go into a discussion about that week's *Torah* portion without ever breaking the civil law against reading *Torah*. These portions from the *Nevi'im* became known as the *Haftarah*, which means "other readings," or "completion of the *Torah*."

### ~ Y'shua Read the Haftarah ~

In *Y'shua's* day it was customary (as it is today in orthodox synagogues) for both the weekly *Torah* and *Haftarah* portions of Scripture to be read each Sabbath. This provided the basis for discussion by anyone who might want to comment upon them. It was also common to invite a distinguished guest to participate in the *Torah* or *Haftarah* readings and make whatever comments they deemed appropriate.

This was the situation in which *Y'shua* found Himself when He visited his hometown of Nazareth, and went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as was His custom:

**"So He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up. And as His custom was, He went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and stood up to read." (Luke 4:16)**

The passage He was given to read (Isa. 61:1-2) is not found in the *Haftarah* readings of today which are based on the *Annual Cycle*. However, that passage would have been read during the Hebrew month of *Heshvan* in the third year (week 35) of this *Triennial Cycle*.

### ~ The Triennial Cycle ~

The enclosed *Triennial Cycle* is based upon the research efforts of *Congregation Beikvot HaMashiach (Followers of Messiah)* of Seattle, Washington. For the benefit of the Body of Messiah, they have given us permission to share their work with you, our readers.

The members of *Congregation Beikvot HaMashiach* have spent untold hours combing various Jewish source materials in order to recreate the ancient *Triennial Cycle*. As a result of this study, they have discovered some unique features which are not found in the *Annual Reading Cycle*:

- ◆ The readings are much shorter than with the *Annual Cycle*; since it takes three years to read the entire *Torah* and *Haftarah*, rather than one year. This allows more time for in-depth study.
- ◆ The schedule calls for one of the Psalms to be sung by the congregation almost every week. This adds another meaningful dimension to the study. Amazingly, the 150 Psalms, when used in numerical order over the three years, always fit the subject of the *Torah* and *Haftarah* readings!

- ◆ When these readings are used according to this schedule, it will be noted that one is learning of major events at the time of their occurrence. For example, at Passover season, Passover will be the subject in each of the three years. There are also prescribed Scripture readings and Psalms to be sung for each of the Festivals.
- ◆ The Apostolic portions are suggested readings on the same subject. It is the goal of *Congregation Beikvot HaMashiach* to have the Apostolic portions encompass the whole of Apostolic Writ.

Thus, with the *Triennial Torah Reading Schedule*, all four of the major divisions of the Scriptures are represented; the *Torah*, the Prophets and the Writings, plus the Apostolic Writings.

~ Getting Started With ~  
~ The Triennial Cycle ~

It is recommended that you coordinate your reading schedule with other Believers throughout the world who have already begun the cycle. This can be done by joining in where *Congregation Beikvot HaMashiach* is currently studying. The calendar dates are given

in the second column of each year's readings.

There are a total of 152 sequential readings in the *Triennial Cycle*. When a thirteenth month (*Adar II*) occurs, four additional readings are inserted. These four readings are currently found at the end of the Year 2 list. In addition, special readings are included for each of the Festivals. These are found on page 6.

~ Commentaries ~

Study guides have been developed, by *Congregation Beikvot HaMashiach*, which can be used to aid groups that want to begin using the *Triennial Cycle*. For more information log on to their website at:

There are also many fine Jewish commentaries available which discuss the *Torah* portions, some of which include the *Haftarah* readings as well. However, all of these are divided up into *parashot* that follow the *Annual Cycle* rather than the *Triennial Cycle*. Therefore, when using one of them, be mindful that they are covering a larger portion of Scripture each *Sabbath*.
